This summer, we would like you to read **at least** three books: one that's a **MIRROR**, one that's a **window**, and one that's a **sliding glass door**.

This will allow you to compare your life and your experiences to those in the book.	one that allows you to enter a new world. You feel like you're in a new place when you read it. *This could also be a non-fiction book where you learn about a new topic.**
