

MODEL POLICIES FOR RESPONDING TO SEXUAL MISCONDUCT IN SCHOOLS

Model Policy for Responding to Student Misconduct in Schools

addresses misconduct between students. The model policy addresses acts of sexual, physical, and emotional misconduct and encompasses:

- Teen dating violence and sexual assault (purview primarily of DVCC in partnership with CPAC)
- Delaware School Crimes Act
- Federal Title IX requirements

Model Policy for Responding to Adult Sexual Misconduct in Schools

Addresses the requirements of <u>SB290</u> and <u>SB291</u> regarding adult sexual misconduct model policies and training. This model policy addresses the response to an incident that follows (as applicable) the student model policy and encompasses:

- Identification of the misconduct
- Immediate response by school employees and volunteers
- Required immediate notifications
- Next steps by school employees and volunteers
- Immediate response by the school administration
- Follow-up actions by the school administration
- Response by law enforcement or school resource officers
- Resources

Model Policy for Appropriate Adult Conduct with Students

Addresses:

- Establishment of appropriate and inappropriate interactions between adults and students, including electronic communication.
- Provisions on hiring practices and reference checks.
